# Responder's new suit bids and opener's limit rebid

#### Responder's new suit bids

A **major** suit fit is by far the best. If partner opens in a minor and you have 4 card support but also have a four card major, bid your major.

It is important to bid your suits in the correct order. Priorities are:

- Longest suit
- Lower of two 4-card suits
- Higher ranking of two 5-card suit
- Try and keep the bidding as low as possible to give you room to find a fit.

#### Responder's bids

**Important** – Responder's **new suit** is **forcing** 

They are **unlimited** bids and can have a wide range of points (6 -19+)

## Responses to the opening bid with NO FIT

•	Bid & change suit at 1-level	6+	4+ suit
•	Bid & change suit at 2-level	10+	4+ suit ( <b>don't jump</b> )
•	Bid 1NT	6-9	denies a 4+ card suit at the 1-level

Note: A response of 2♥ to partner's 1♠ requires **five** hearts as well as 10+ points

## Opener's rebids after a new suit response

•	Support partner's suit	4+ in that suit
•	Bid NT	balanced
•	Bid a new suit (next week)	4+ in the 2 <sup>nd</sup> suit
•	Rebid long suit	5+ in the suit

## **Opener supports Responder's Suit**

It is important to support partner's suit if possible, particularly in a major

After 1♥ –1♠			
2♠	12-15	4-card support	single raise
3♠	16-18	4-card support	invitational raise
4 🛦	19+	4-card support	game raise

#### Opener bids Notrumps - showing a balanced hand

## Rule of 14 for responding at the 2 level

This is a quick way of deciding whether you are strong enough to respond at the 2 level.

Add the number of cards in your longest suit to your high card points. If the total is 14 or more, you are strong enough to respond at the 2 level. If not, you should bid 1NT.

This is just another way of counting 'length' points.

Consider the following hand:

South	North	Fast	South	West

♣ A J 9 4 3				

You have 8 points and 5 clubs, giving a total of 13, so you should respond 1NT. If you count 'length' points you have 8 + 1 = 9 points.

Add either a jack or a 6th club and you can respond 2♣.

With this next hand you have 8 points and 6 clubs, a total of 14. If you count 'length' points you have 8 + 2 = 10 points.
