### Answer: 2♦

We are commanding partner to bid  $2^{\checkmark}$ , which we will pass. Without transfers we would have had to bid  $2^{\checkmark}$  and we would be declarer, with partner's stronger hand in dummy, visible to our opponents.

#### **Answer: 2NT**

After our transfer to hearts, our 2NT rebid shows that we have EXACTLY 5 hearts and a 'game invitational' hand (11-12 points). If partner is maximum she can choose between 3NT and 4. Otherwise she either passes or signs off in 3.

#### Answer: 3NT

Shows game-going values with EXACTLY 5 spades. Partner has to choose between passing (with two spades) and bidding  $4 \frac{1}{2}$  (with 3+ spades)

#### Answer: 2NT

We have 11 HCP, enough for game (25 HCP) if partner has a maximum 14 HCP. With a balanced hand and no major we just make an invitational bid in NT. Partner will bid game with a maximum.

#### Answer: 3NT

Partner's 1NT overcall shows 16-18 HCP and a club stop. We have a combined 26+ HCP so game-going values. After showing our spades via a transfer, we jump to 3NT to offer partner the choice between 3NT and  $4 \stackrel{\triangle}{\Phi}$ .

#### **Answer:** Pass

Playing transfers, we can't sign off in a minor suit at the 2-level. With only five diamonds, it's best to pass and hope that West will bid a suit. If West doubles for penalties we can bid a natural 2 (weak takeout) next time round.

#### Answer: 2♣

We cannot make a weak takeout at the 2 level by bidding  $2^{\spadesuit}$  as partner will transfer to hearts. Our  $2^{\spadesuit}$  bid is a request to partner to bid  $3^{\clubsuit}$ . We will then bid  $3^{\spadesuit}$ , showing a very weak hand and long diamonds.

Our hand will probably produce no tricks in No Trumps but we can offer at least three diamond tricks if diamonds are trumps.

#### Answer: Pass.

We should pass rather than make a weak takeout into  $3^{\bullet}$ . We have combined 21+ HCP so should make 1NT, which scores the same as  $3^{\bullet}$ , and if we make 8 tricks in No Trumps we will get an even better score.
